There are 11 Members of the Legislative Council, known as MLCs. 8 are elected by the House of Keys for a five year term. The other 3 sit ex officio: the Bishop, the Attorney-General, and the President of Tynwald.

The Lord Bishop takes part in debate and has a right to vote. The Attorney-General plays an advisory role and cannot vote. The President of Tynwald is the Presiding Officer.

The main business of the Legislative Council is to examine Bills or draft laws. Since most Bills begin their passage through Tynwald in the House of Keys, the Council mainly acts as a revising chamber.

The Legislative Council has its origins in the King's or Lord's Council, a group of people who gave advice to the ruler of the Isle of Man.
